Top 10 Talent**

1. Kodjo Nami was essential when an individual had to be removed due to an emergency from an SLP to a residential group home. He has personally trained all new staff on how to work with the individual at both the day site and the residence. It was his flexibility in changing his entire schedule that allowed this person to remain in our day and residential services. Kodjo owns his own personal business in addition to being a DSP and was still able to do what it takes to help us keep this person safe and happy. When it comes to filling in and taking shifts, Kodjo is always more than happy to help if he is not already scheduled. This individual is currently thriving, he is the healthiest he has been in 2 years, he is participating in the community, he is actively involved his day-to-day routine more than ever, and this person's parents are extremely satisfied with their son's progress.

While at the day site Kodjo has been essential with supporting his manager during crisis situations. When staff (including the manager) are overwhelmed, Kodjo steps in and assists with ease. There is not a task too large or too small for Kodjo, nor a problem brought to him by the individuals he supports that he cannot tackle with them while making them feel important and involved.

Kodjo looks out for his fellow teammates. He is consistently observing and willing to switch out with peers when their person has been too stressful to support. He can sense when his peers need a break and does not hesitate to switch staffing. Kodjo cancelled his holiday plans to work at a house due to other staff not wanting to pick it up. Kodjo has done this on 3 separate occasions in the past year.

Kodjo models all of our agency's values. He is never seen without a pleasant thing to say and a smile on his face. His peers look up to him and find him to be a fantastic role model. He offers to help staff with any situation. His patience and calm demeanor translate into successful when supporting more difficult individuals and can de-escalate any situation immediately.

When you ask Kodjo about his job, he is here for the people. He is here because he wants to provide equal opportunity for those we serve. He never boasts, he will never accept tokens of appreciation because he is here for them and for them only. To top it off Kodjo has not been late to a shift...ever! (Kodjo was nominated unanimously by his Area Director, all 5 area coordinators, and the entire management team of the most deserving person to be recognized and worthy of this honor - **ILC**)

2. Christie Dennis takes our core values very seriously and strives to help people build meaningful relationships with those around them! The ladies she works with love people and being involved in life around them. Christie is always looking for opportunities to help them gather with friends. She comes up with creative ways to get them connected with people so that they can have authentic relationships. One week it may be a painting party, another smore's and boardgames. Planned or impromptu, it doesn't matter! She doesn't shy away from the extra work that it takes to help the ladies host gatherings or plan trips to see the cranes, go to the zoo, check out a pumpkin patch, the list continues to go on and on.

Christie is selfless. She steps up willingly when she is needed in locations/shifts that are not her regular one. She has trained with numerous other people so that if needed she can step in. Previously she worked one-on-one with a person many others were not able to work with; patiently, respectfully assisting this person to live the best life she possible...letting the flowery names that she was called -- sometimes multiple times a day--- roll off her back...often defusing her through humor or just letting her know she understood. And when she came to me and talked about this lady, it was with a smile and fondness or maybe some sadness that she couldn't fix things for her. Not once do I remember it being with sheer exasperation or frustration! She is respectful to others whether they are people we support, staff, family, or just others in the community.

Christie assisted the ladies in planning a vacation with friends to Branson, MO. (This was the 1st time any of the ladies went on a vacation with more than family, just their roommates and/or just staff. And she was excited to help them make this happen! Even though 2 of the ladies use wheelchairs, it didn't limit her vision of what could be done on this trip. Even people she doesn't work with directly get so excited to go places with her because she always finds something they enjoy and visits with them about it.

Christie is a problem solver, and provides an environment filled with positivity and security. And no matter what's going on in her personal life, she puts her all into making sure that the ladies she works with feel safe and relaxed in their home! (Nominated by Anni Schaldecker - **Region V**)

3. Jenifer Phinney is one of the most amazing people I know. She has the heart of Jesus and the actions of Captain Marvel. Every day she gets up to help people. She works endless hours. She never says no. I realize that is not healthy, but she wants to help everyone! She is our medical DSP and works the floor every day. She picks up hours constantly to work with emergency shared living placements, in-home hours, taking people to appointments, and constantly communicating with stakeholders and families. She helps individuals get groceries, get their medicine, and learn to communicate with their devices. She always wants them to be as independent as possible. The picture I sent is just one unbelievable example of her taking an individual who ALWAYS utilizes a wheelchair. Yet, that day she took her swimming and got her into a flotation tube instead of her wheelchair! That is just superhero quality! Everyday Jenifer does these amazing things for our individuals. Last week she worked her regular day hours and then worked another 30 hours to care for an emergency shared living placement for an individual with significant behavioral needs. She always steps up to help when needed. A few weeks ago, she worked an extra twenty hours getting an individual admitted into the hospital so she could get the care she needed for her medical and mental health when no one else would care for her needs. His overall positive and laid-back attitude is unmatched during high stress situations. He remains calm, follows plans, and diffuses situations.

Zach's dedication is unsurpassed. Throughout the course of the pandemic, Zach has helped anywhere needed. Ranging from picking up a variety of different shifts (there isn't one he won't do), coming up with new creative ways to continue engagement, and making life easier for everyone around him. Dawn knows programs of the people she supports and does a great job at following them. She offers suggestions and ask questions as well to continuously look for ways to better someone's life. She has been recognized a DSP of the Month within the last year, has been nominated numerous times, and has received several impressions on Paylocity that includes being a team player, help, leadership, get it done, and mentor. She takes feedback well from her supervisors and you can see she genuinely wants to be the best at her job and lead her team of fellow DSPs. Dawn has gone on several trips with a person she supports to Sydney Ne. She understands how much this person misses their family and will take time away from her own family to ensure he gets to visit his.
